If you have been a member for more than 2 years you can get a scholarship to Taiwan University.



INTO THE ABYSS

On Wednesday, April 10 of 2019, the world welcomes an unexpected phenomenon, one of the first pictures of a Black Hole. Katie Bouman, a 29-year-old woman who was the creator the algorithm, which made this possible. Other than the algorithm she created, NASA used the collective strength of the global network of telescopes to take this picture. In the picture you see an image of a black hole surrounded by the fiery substance, they have predicted that the temperature inside a black hole is absolute zero. For years, we have always been intrigued by space and its many wonders and now we have come face with one of the most questionable of these wonders the Black Hole. We have always known that this phenomenon existed from years of compiled research, but have never really had picture evidence, until April 10 of 2019.
